Summary

Anne Elvey is a poet, editor and researcher. Anne received a PhD in Women's Studies from Monash University in 2000 for her research on an ecological feminist reading of the Gospel of Luke, revised and published as An Ecological Feminist Reading of the Gospel of Luke: A Gestational Paradigm (Mellen, 2005). Her most recent scholarly books are Reading with Earth: Contributions of the New Materialism to an Ecological Feminist Hermeneutics (Bloomsbury T&T Clark 2022), winner of the inaugural ANZATS Book Prize for an Established Scholar, and Reading the Magnificat in Australia: Unsettling Engagements (Sheffield Phoenix Press, 2020). Anne was editor of Colloquium: The Australian and New Zealand Theological Review from May 2012 to May 2017 and president of the Fellowship for Biblical Studies in 2011. She was an Adjunct Research Fellow at Monash University for many years until May 2024 and has held honorary research positions at University of Divinity for over a decade, most recently as an Honorary Research Fellow at Pilgrim Theological College, University of Divinity, from late 2022 until July 2024.

Leaf (Liquid Amber Press, 2022), shortlisted in the 2023 ASLE-UKI Book Prize for the best work of creative writing with an ecological theme, Obligations of voice (Recent Work Press, 2021), On arrivals of breath (Poetica Christi Press, 2019) and White on White (Cordite Books, 2018) are her most recent poetry collections. Anne's chapbook, This flesh that you know (Leaf Press, 2015) was the international winner of the Overleaf Chapbook Manuscript Award 2015 and her collection Kin (Five Islands Press, 2014) was shortlisted for the Kenneth Slessor Poetry Prize 2015 in the NSW Premier's Literary Awards. She is co-author of Intatto/Intact (La Vita Felice, 2017), an Italian-English collection of ecopoetry with Massimo D'Arcangelo and Helen Moore, and translators Francesco Cosi, Alessandra Repossi and Todd Portnowitz. Anne was inaugurator and managing editor of Plumwood Mountain: An Australian Journal of Ecopoetry and Ecopoetics, from 2013 to 2020, and was editor in chief with Melbourne Poets' Union, from 2016 to 2018. She is a regular participant in a poetry workshop facilitated by Rose Lucas.

Anne's research interests are in ecological poetics, ecological feminist hermeneutics, the new materialism, biblical literature (esp. Gospel of Luke) and its afterlives, responses to child sexual abuse in the Roman Catholic church, and unsettling whiteness.
